TANKLESS WATER HEATER

VS

TANK WATER HEATER

SIZE

Suitcase size up to 30" in tall.
Weight 50–70 pounds.
Have to be hung up on a wall.

Up to 60" in tall.
Weight 155 lbs empty, over 550 lbs full of water.
Takes up larger area in closet, attic, or garage.

COST

Tankless water heaters require additional vents and gas lines, making their installation costs higher than traditional water heaters.

Despite the initial expense, tankless water heaters offer lower operating costs and longer lifespans, which can help offset the upfront investment.

Tank water heaters are cost-effective to purchase and simpler to install initially.

However, they consume more energy monthly as they keep water heated continuously.

CAPACITY

Tankless water heaters offer a continuous supply of hot water without running out.

For homes with high water usage and multiple sources, multiple tankless heaters may be necessary to meet demand, as they heat water on demand only.

Tank water heaters have a limited storage capacity based on the size of the tank, which can lead to running out of hot water during high-demand periods.

FLOOD RISK

Tankless water heaters do not store water like traditional tank water heaters. They heat water on demand as it passes through the unit.

Tankless water heaters minimize the risk of water damage or leaks compared to tank water heaters.

Tank water heaters have a higher risk of flooding in case of leaks or tank rupture due to the stored water volume.

If a tank water heater malfunctions, it can result in significant water damage and potential flooding in the surrounding area.

LIFESPAN
